


REGISTRATION FOR VISITING INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE STUDENTS

- Boston University Summer Term has an open enrollment policy.
- Visiting international students do not need to be formally admitted to BU to register for summer classes.
- Dedicated staff members assist international students throughout the enrollment process.
- International students may request a student visa by registering for two Summer Term courses (8 credits) over six weeks or by enrolling in three courses (12 credits) over twelve weeks.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

- Summer students are required to have English-language skills equivalent to the minimum proficiency scores posted at bu.edu/summer/partners/english-proficiency.
