Halls of residence

All our halls are designed to ensure that you feel part of a great community. Students who apply early have a better chance of securing their preferred accommodation. Hall prices range from £103 to £184* per week depending on your choice of halls:

- Self-catered or catered
- En suite or shared bathrooms
- Shared flats, studio flats or corridor rooms
- Accommodation suitable for students with disabilities
- Female or male-only designated areas

Joining us for the autumn term?

If you are a Study Abroad student starting at Portsmouth in the autumn term of the academic year, you can secure a guaranteed room in halls of residence. All you need to do is meet our accommodation and deposit deadlines. So, make sure you apply early. As a Study Abroad student, you can apply for accommodation as soon as you have accepted your course offer.

Joining us for the spring term?

If your Study Abroad course starts in the spring term, you can apply for accommodation during our autumn term. There is a good chance we can offer you a place in halls, but this depends on availability.

If you do not get a place in halls, it is usually easy to find private rented accommodation in the city. We can support you to find a suitable place – whether in a shared student house, lodgings or a private hall.

Privately rented shared houses/flats

If you miss our deadlines or prefer not to live in halls, there is a lot of private rented accommodation available in the city. You can expect to pay around £90–£120 per week for a room in a shared flat or house (usually houses) and £60–£65 for food and household bills per week on top of the rent price. Lodgings, where the landlord lives on the premises, are usually in the £90–£130 per week range. This will include all your bills and may include some meals too.

Student Housing Team

Wherever you choose to live, our dedicated Student Housing team will help you with your accommodation throughout your time with us. The team can advise you on your options, explain our various hall facilities, help with private housing, check contracts, give deposit advice and even help you find your housemates.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

International Orientation and airport pick-up service

A dedicated service to assist you as you settle into academic and city life; from registration procedure, introducing you to the local banks and services, to arranging city tours for you to get to know Portsmouth.

You will also benefit from a departmental induction to introduce you to all aspects of your academic programme and environment at Portsmouth.

We also offer an airport pick-up service from London Heathrow for a small charge. Information about our Orientation programme can be found at **www.port.ac.uk/firstweek**.

Visas

Depending on nationality, you will either need to obtain your visa before travelling or you can obtain a Standard Visitor Visa (for the purpose of study) at the Border, on entry to the UK. You can check the type of visa you need at the UK's Government website **www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa**.

If you choose to study at Portsmouth for one term only, you can apply for a Standard Visitor visa (for the purpose of study). Under this type of visa, you can study for up to six months with no entitlement to extend for further study, change of course, or take any paid or unpaid employment.

Alternatively, you may apply for the UKVI Student Route visa. You will need to specify which type of visa you will be applying for so we can provide you with the right document. Students who will attend for a full academic year can only apply for a UKVI Student Route visa.

For both types of visa, you may be required to apply for an Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS) certificate should your course and nationality requires it.

You should apply for your visa once you have received the relevant supporting visa document from the University. Please refer to the UK Government website for visas and immigration for details on visas and pricing at **www.gov.uk/visas-immigration**.

Visa regulations change frequently. Please check the latest guidelines to make sure you you apply for the appropriate visa.

Cost of living

Portsmouth enjoys a low cost of living compared with many other cities in the south east of England. It is ranked in the top 20 most affordable university cities in the UK (NatWest Student Living Index 2020). We advise you to budget around £9,500 for each academic year to cover accommodation and living costs. Other living costs depend on your lifestyle. This should cover accommodation, food, local travelling expenses, books, stationery, and leisure activities. This does not include tuition fees.

Financial aid for US students

The Education Abroad Office at your home university will be able to advise if you are entitled to receive deferral student aid during your Study Abroad period. You can find more information at **www.studentaid.ed.gov**. If you are receiving a Federal Direct Loan, please note that the University of Portsmouth is an eligible federal loan institution and our school code is G21159.



Healthcare and Insurance

If you are applying for the UKVI Student Route visa for a duration of six months or more, you are required to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS) as a compulsory part of your visa application. This will give you access to NHS healthcare.

If your study abroad period is less than six months, and you have a Standard Visitor visa (for the purpose of study), you can still access medical care, but you will be required to pay for the service so it is important that your medical insurance is adequate. Helpful information about healthcare can be found on the UKCISA website **www.ukcisa.org.uk**.

If you are studying in the UK for six months or more you can register with a GP (doctor). If you are studying for less than six months you may be able to register as a temporary patient with a GP surgery and you will be able to access NHS walk-in services.

It is strongly recommended that all students obtain comprehensive travel and medical insurance with sickness cover before arriving in the UK to cover the period of stay.

STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMME

You can choose to study at Portsmouth for a half (one term) or full academic year. You will study in classes alongside full-time British and international students. Learning is undertaken through lectures as well as smaller seminar and tutorial classes, giving you an opportunity to work closely with, and get to know other students on vour course.

Modules are weighted with either 10 credits (2.5 US/5 ECTS) or 20 credits (5 US/10 ECTS), so the number of classes you take will vary depending on your choices. As an international student, you would be expected to be studying full time, taking 60 UK credits each term or 120 UK credits for a full academic year. You can expect to study in the classroom for 12–15 hours per week, with another 12–15 hours of independent study.


ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- At least one year of university education in a relevant maior/minor.
- The minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) is 2.6 or equivalent.
- Minimum English language level (for students whose first language is not English): IELTS 6.0 or equivalent with no component less than 5.5. If your level is below this, you may be eligible for a Pre-sessional English course (autumn-entry only).

Transfer of credit

You must gain approval from your home university before accepting an offer to study at the University of Portsmouth and should seek advice regarding the most appropriate modules to study. Credits gained from the University of Portsmouth can be transferred to your university, subject to approval from your home university. To be awarded credits, you must complete the required assessments for each module which on completion of your study period you will receive an academic transcript.



Transition Scholarship

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss national student, the Transition Scholarship is applied to your tuition fees so you pay the same amount as a UK student. For more information visit **www.port.ac.uk/eufees**.

How to pay your tuition fees

Once you receive an offer to study with us, You will need to pay a deposit to confirm your place. This deposit will count towards your tuition fees. You can pay your deposit through the application portal.

You can pay your fees in a number of ways using Webpay.

You can make one-off payments for fees and set up Bank Transfers, Recurring Card payments and Direct Debit instructions. You will need your student ID number to do this. If you are paying your own fees, you should choose 'self' from the 'Payer relationship' drop-down menu on the Webpay form.

If someone else is paying your fees for you, they can make payments or set up a payment plan on WebPay. To do this, they will need your student ID number, full name and date of birth. The person completing the form will need to verify their relationship to you.

POSTGRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES

While it may be too early to start thinking about life after university, it is important to know what opportunities are available to you. Many students choose to continue their studies and gain a Master's degree:

- To develop a second area of expertise
- To increase their confidence when job hunting
- To begin the first stage in an academic career
- Simply for the love of a subject

In the UK, postgraduate degrees are normally completed in one year when studying full time (this may be different depending on the degree choice), meaning that students can save money on tuition and living expenses, and accelerate their entry into the world of work. 

Therefore, please check with the Exchanges and Study Abroad Team that your chosen subject modules are available for proposed study duration. It is important that you read and make sure you understand this disclaimer. In the event that you become a student at the University of Portsmouth, this becomes part of any contract between you and the University and you will be bound by its terms. You are advised to check the University website for the most up-to-date information at all times and/or contact the University for further details if you are at any time uncertain of information. We (the University of Portsmouth) have checked the information in this publication and believe that it is accurate at the time of going to press (April 2021).

However, course and module details and other information may change over time, either where changes are unavoidable through, for example, staff changes or where it is believed that the changes would be beneficial to the course such as updating the course to reflect changes in the discipline or industry. The University will take all reasonable steps to minimise the impact of any changes on students. Applicants for such courses will be informed of any significant changes with as much notice as possible so the effects can be considered by you. 


