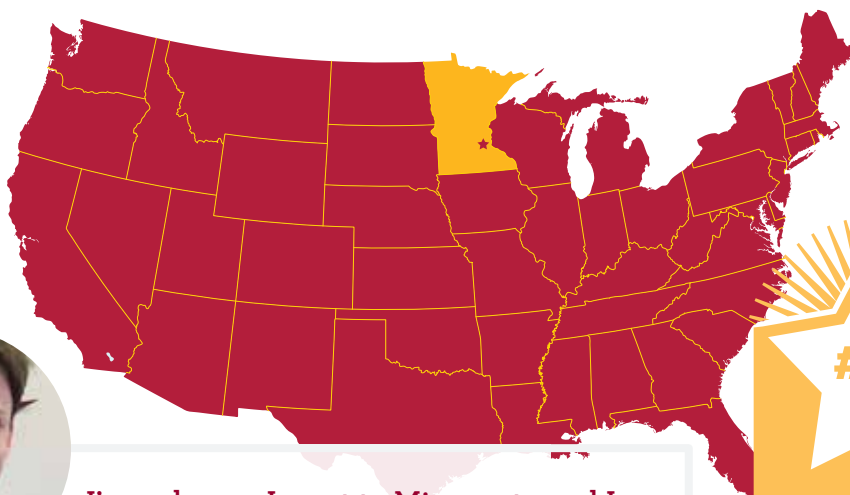
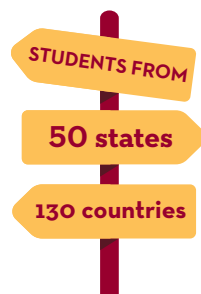

**COST** **Program Fee:** \$2,950
