13. Health Insurance

As required by the California State University, F-1 students must maintain adequate health insurance coverage during their studies at Sonoma State University. Semester at Sonoma students are required to purchase the insurance offered by CSU HealthLink. The international student requirements for insurance are:

- Medical benefits of at least \$100,000.00 per accident or illness
- Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000
- Expenses associated with the medical evacuation of the international student to his or her home country in the amount of \$50,000
- A deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness

Waivers for this requirement will only be provided to students who are sponsored by their program or government and must be requested from the Center for International Education.

I understand and agree that if I am admitted to Sonoma State University (SSU) as an international student, my status is that of a non-degree student.

Should I wish to change my status to that of a degree-seeking international student, I am aware that I will need to satisfy all admission requirements of SSU.

I will take part the mandatory orientation program for international students. I must be flexible in the selection and scheduling of the courses that I wish to take, and that enrollment of specific courses are not guaranteed. I must also not expect to take subjects in the areas which are impacted.

In addition to the above, I also understand and agree to the following terms and conditions of my studies at SSU, and that failure to comply with the terms and conditions listed below can lead to termination of my visa status in the U.S.:

- I am required to maintain good academic standing (defined as minimum Grad Point Average of 2.0 for undergraduate students and 3.0 for graduate students) each term, and to register and maintain full-time enrollment (minimum 12 units for undergraduate students and 8 units for graduate students) each term.
- I am required to pay the Semester at Sonoma program fees and other costs that I incur at my host campus by the deadline(s), pertaining but not limited to the following: housing, phone usage, utilities, library books, health services, and student activities.
- I must purchase and maintain student health insurance (as indicated in Question 13) for myself and for any dependents with me in the USA for the full length of my stay.
- I must obey the regulations and policies of Sonoma State University as well as the laws of the State of California and the United States.

16. Submission of Application

To complete your application for the Semester at Sonoma program, submit this form plus the following to the Center for International Education (CIE) at SSU:

- Verification of Financial Support form, with supporting documents. See form (SUP A) following this page.
- Statement of Purpose (one page maximum). Please tell us why you are interested in studying at SSU.
- Passport Photocopy
- TOEFL or IELTS official score report
- Official transcripts from all universities listed in Question 9
- Pay \$150.00 Application Fee (Non- refundable) <https://payment.flywire.com/pay/payment>

Your application will not be considered without the above items. If you are admitted, SSU will issue you a letter of admission and a Form I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Non-Immigrant Status). These admission documents will be mailed to your home country address, or agent address. The Form I-20 from SSU enables you to apply for the F-1 visa.

Do not plan on leaving your country of residence until you have been issued the visa; it will allow you to enter the U.S. up to 30 days before your program start date.

VERIFICATION OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

All Semester at Sonoma applicants are required to provide proof of funding for their studies at Sonoma State University. This is a requirement for Form I-20 issuance. The estimated costs for the Semester at Sonoma program are listed below. If you will be attending SSU for one or two semesters, be sure that you have sufficient funding.
