What does "academic level" mean?
We offer a wide range of programs at KPU, and they all fall into one of the following levels: preparatory, undergraduate, graduate, and vocational. Within these levels, a program may be open intake or limited intake

## PREPARATORY PROGRAM

Post-secondary programs or courses below the undergraduate level, like KPU's English Language Studies program, fall into this category.

## UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

Post-secondary programs at the post-baccalaureate diploma level or below are considered
undergraduate. KPU offers certificates, diplomas, ssociate's degrees, bachelor's degrees, and postbaccalaureate diplomas at the undergraduate level.

## GRADUATE PROGRAM

Post-secondary programs above the undergraduate level. Graduate programs will generally require applicants to have a recognized undergraduate or graduate degree in order to apply. KPU offers graduate certificate and graduate diploma programs.

## VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Programs that combine skills and knowledge specific to a particular industry or career. These programs blend in-class learning with time on the job working with an employer sponsor.

OPEN INTAKE: These programs are open for admission at every intake (Fall, Spring, and Summer). Students who meet the admission requirements and apply by the application deadline are great candidates for admission.

Limited intake: These programs are highly competitive and only admit a select number f students per intake. Not all limited intake programs are offered at all intakes, and application deadlines are earlier than for open intake programs. In general, they'll also have supplementary admission requirements (such as portfolio reviews, interviews, GPA requirements).

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

## UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be admitted as a student in an undergraduate program, you must show that:
» You meet KPU's Undergraduate English Proficiency Requirement
You have graduated from high school (secondary school) or completed 24 or more undergraduate-level credits with a minimum cumulative GPA of $2.0^{\star}$

To be admitted as a student to a post-baccalaureate or graduate program, you must show that

## English Proficiency

## Requirements for Admission

All applicants to an undergraduate or graduate level program at KPU must meet the Undergraduate English Proficiency Requirement in order to be admitted.

The Undergraduate English Proficiency Requirement can be fulfilled through any ONE of the following ways:

## HIGH SCHOOL COURSES

» British Columbia High School: BC English Studies 12, English First Peoples 12, or Literary Studies 12 with a minimum grade of $\mathrm{C}+$ (Canadian equivalents also accepted: kpu.ca/admission/canadianequivalencies)
» International Baccalaureate (IB): IB English A1/A2 (HL or SL) with a minimum grade of 3 (or C+)
» Advanced Placement (AP): AP English Language and Composition or AP English Literature and Composition with a minimum grade of 2 (or $\mathrm{C}+$ )
It may be possible to use high school courses from other countries where English is the official language to fulfill the Undergraduate English Proficiency Requirement. Transcript

## KPU COURSES

» ELST 0381 and ELST 0383 (or equivalents) with a minimum grade of $B$ in both courses, or ELST 0381 with a minimum grade of B and a KPU placement score higher than ELST 0383 level
» Completion of ENGQ 1091, ENGQ 1092, or ENGQ 1099 (or equivalents) with a minimum grade of $C$

## TESTING OPTIONS

" KPU English Placement Test (EPT): Placement into ENGL 1100
» IELTS: Overall band of 6.5 or higher with a minimum 6.0 in each band, taken within the last two years from the term of admission
» TOEFL: iBT 88 or higher, with no subscore less than 20 , taken within the last two years from the term of admission
» CAEL: Score of 70 or higher with no subscore less than 60 , taken within the last two years from the term of admission

" PTE: Score of 61 or higher, taken within the last two years from the term of admission
» LPI: Level 5 with an essay score of 30 or higher, taken within the last two years from the term of admission
» Duolingo English Test: Score of 110 or higher, taken within the last two years from the term of admission (accepted on a temporary basis until in-person testing resumes)

## Don't meet the English Proficiency Requirement?

KPU offers a preparatory program called Pathway to Undergraduate Studies that upgrades your English to KPU admission standards. The best part is, you'll be eligible for undergraduate studies at KPU after completion of the Pathway-no new application required.

## HOW IT WORKS

» Apply to an open intake undergraduate program at KPU with an IELTS score of 4.5-6.0 (or equivalent)
» Be admitted to KPU as a Pathway 1 (beginner), Pathway 2 (intermediate), or Pathway 3 (advanced) student
» Study at KPU as a Pathway student, taking a blend of mandatory English upgrading and optional undergraduate-level courses, until you complete Pathway 3.
Congratulations! You've now met the KPU Undergraduate English Proficiency Requirement for admission. You can now continue your studies at KPU as a full-time undergraduate student.
