
- Nearly 70 percent of our students receive some form of financial aid.

Our Vision



Our location is an incredible draw. We're in one of the world's best areas for outdoor recreation and just one mile from the shores of Monterey Bay, the largest marine sanctuary on the West Coast. This means lots of opportunities for environmental study, not to mention surfing, hiking, kayaking, sailing, biking, hanging out at the beach and more.

Incredible Learning Environment

Monterey Bay isn't just for scientists and surfers (though we have our share). The communities that surround our campus offer a wide range of cultural activities, while maintaining a friendly, small-town feel. Plus, all the major metropolitan attractions of the San Francisco Bay Area are just a two-hour drive away.

In short, Cal State Monterey Bay offers an incredible learning environment. From our campus, you can look out on the lush agricultural fields of the Salinas Valley, the historic city of Monterey, and the bay itself – all places where students apply their learning through internships, service learning and research.

A Rich History

Our campus is on the site of the former Fort Ord Army base, which has some perks. For example, the residence hall rooms are much bigger than average because they are in remodeled officer quarters. In keeping with our green philosophy, we've reused whenever possible, so you'll find many bits and pieces of this history all over campus.



STUDENT LIFE

One of the only residential campuses in the CSU, Cal State Monterey Bay provides a rich campus life experience.

The heart of campus is the green-certified Tanimura & Antle Family Memorial Library. It's common to see faculty holding office hours in the coffee shop. Or study groups meeting in skyboxes that jut into the upper levels of the atrium.

The library is also home to the university's academic support services, such as tutoring, workshops and undergraduate research.

When not studying, students can participate in one of more than 100 clubs and groups. CSUMB is home to a world-class 27-hole disc golf course, also the classroom for KIN 141: Disc Golf. Our Disc Golf Club has won the national championship three years in a row.

The university's outdoor recreation program is a gateway for local outdoor adventures. Bikes can be rented for getting around campus and into town.

Intercollegiate athletics at CSUMB is a source of campus pride. Otter Athletics sponsors 13 sports, competing at the NCAA Division II level nationally with conference affiliations in the California Collegiate Athletic Association and Western Water Polo Association.

Otter student-athletes excel both in the classroom and in competition. As students, they annually compile aggregate GPAs and graduation rates higher than the general student body. As athletes, they consistently compete for conference and national titles, with five Sea Otter teams earning berths in their respective NCAA Championship Tournaments in 2016-17.
