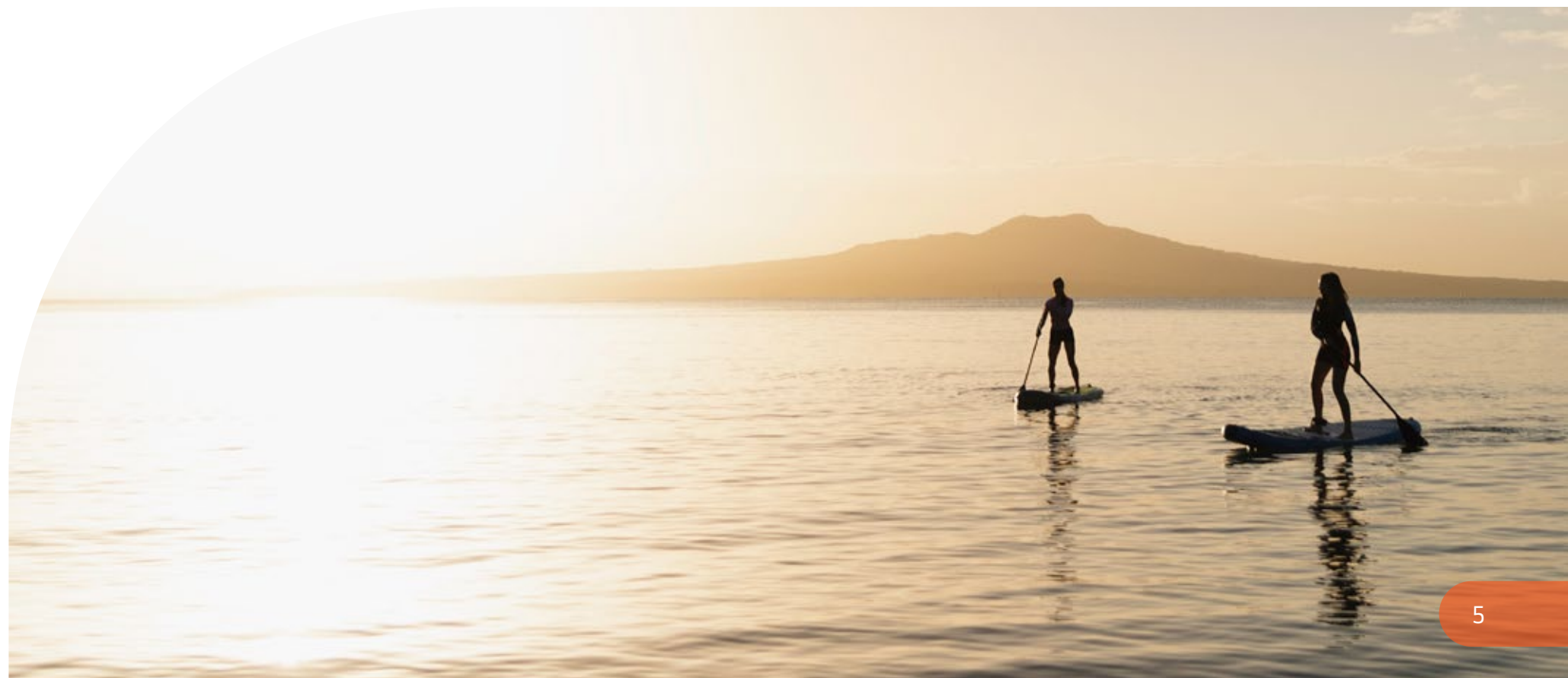
Spectacular nature

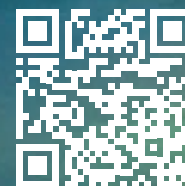

STUDY ABROAD: STUDY A SEMESTER OR A YEAR IN NEW ZEALAND

As a Study Abroad student, you can study at AUT in Auckland for a semester or a year in your chosen subject or in a completely different discipline. By studying with us, you can gain access to everything New Zealand has to offer, while taking part in world-class academic courses, designed to give you powerful, practical, culturally immersive and collaborative learning experiences.

We will give you a unique Kiwi welcome to AUT and New Zealand, and support you while you settle into life and study here.

What you can study

Select from a wide range of courses taught from across our study areas, designing your own semester to study up to four courses that appeal to you. You can also choose to do an internship (the Work Integrated Learning course) alongside one or two other courses.

You'll meet the subject requirements of your home institution, while expanding your educational experience with courses that aren't available at your home university. You can cross-credit the points you earn towards your home degree – and get international experience while you study.

Workload

A typical full-time semester at AUT is 60 points, which is equivalent to four courses. Most courses are 15 points. 60 points is generally considered equivalent to 30 ECTS or 15 US credits.

SEMESTER DATES

Because New Zealand is in the Southern Hemisphere, we have different seasons and dates for our university semesters. Our summer lasts from mid-December to late March. Autumn is between late March and late May. Winter is between June and the end of August. Spring is from September through November.

Our semesters are typically 12 weeks long. Semester 1 begins in late February and ends in late June. Our Semester 2 begins mid-July and ends mid-November. There is a two-week mid-semester break in the middle of each full semester, allowing you to enjoy more of what New Zealand has to offer.

2027 semester dates

Semester 1: 22 February – 18 June

Semester 2: 12 July – 5 November

Orientation is the week before the semester starts, so make sure you arrive for that.

WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING COURSE (INTERNSHIP)

Our Work Integrated Learning course is designed to help you engage with New Zealand’s unique multiculturalism, while gaining valuable exposure to a business, non-profit or research organisation relevant to your field of study. Your internship is complemented by academic assignments, awarding you with a grade and credits toward your degree, while enjoying a level of immersion into New Zealand life that few international students get to experience.

The company we partner with leads the field in managing quality internships so that you can get your foot in the door and get involved with meaningful projects when you arrive. Your placement manager will help you find an organisation, develop your resumé, prepare for your interview and provide overarching support throughout your time in the course. Every step of the way you’ll have the support you need.

You spend 20+ hours per week with your internship organisation, where you’ll contribute, collaborate and connect with your colleagues. Depart with a deeper sense of confidence, practise what you study, and make friends and mentors that can last a lifetime. You combine the Work Integrated Learning course with two other 15-point courses to enrol full-time for your Study Abroad semester, or one other 15-point course for limited full-time enrolment.



Featured course: **TIKA500 International Noho Marae: Indigenous Encounters of a Māori Kind**

We particularly recommend the course **TIKA500 International Noho Marae: Indigenous Encounters of a Māori Kind**. This course offers international students an immersive opportunity to learn with Māori knowledge holders in a marae-based learning environment. Blending academic study with hands-on cultural experience, the course has been one of AUT’s most popular international offerings since 2005. Taught by respected Māori educators, you’ll engage with Māori culture, language, protocols, performing arts and worldviews, including a noho marae overnight stay. Challenging yet rewarding, **TIKA500** is widely described as a transformative experience that fosters belonging and provides lasting insight into Indigenous ways of knowing beyond the classroom.



YOUR NEW HOME: LIVING ON CAMPUS

AUT accommodation options

Te Āhuru Mayoral Drive Student Accommodation

City Campus

- One-minute walk from AUT's main buildings
- Modern, purpose-built, high-spec studio units
- Each unit includes a king single bed, kitchenette with fridge and microwave, bathroom, study desk and chair, storage space
- There are 25 bedrooms (one on each floor) for students with special access needs
- On-site services and facilities include a recreation centre and sports court, 24/7 security, and shared study, social and dining spaces

Akoranga Student Village

North Campus

- Five minutes' walk from AUT's main buildings
- Each apartment is fully furnished with four or five bedrooms, two bathrooms, a shared lounge/dining area and a kitchen
- Some bedrooms have a double bed and some have a single bed
- All bedrooms have a wardrobe, desk, chair and bookshelf
- There are eight bedrooms in the facility available for students with special access needs (including bathrooms open to the person)
- On-site services and facilities include staff who are available 24/7, outdoor spaces and laundry

When you apply to live in AUT student accommodation, you can request to stay in an alcohol-free, single sex or rainbow-friendly apartment.



Residential life

AUT student accommodation runs a variety of social events every month from quizzes and baking challenges to exercise classes and bingo. During Orientation, students will be provided with a calendar of events for the year.

Our social events aim to be accessible to everyone, so students can expect a mix of virtual and in-person activities, for small groups and the full village.

1 May for Semester 2

1 November for Semester 1 the following year

READY TO APPLY?

Excited about joining us and making the most of what AUT and New Zealand have to offer?
The information below outlines what you need to do to get started.

Check if you're eligible

To join the Study Abroad programme, you must have:

- Completed at least one year of full-time study at a recognised university
- A better than average academic record, especially in your most recent year of study
- Met English language requirements (if English is not your first language), equivalent to*:
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.0 overall with all bands 5.5 or higher for undergraduate courses
 - An IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5 overall with all bands 6.0 or higher for postgraduate courses
- Be at least 18 years of age – if you're younger email study.abroad@aut.ac.nz

Country-specific requirements

- **Denmark:** Completed an upper secondary education and obtained an average of at least 7 in English at A or B level on the 7-point scale examination/ Studentereksamen
- **Germany:** Abitur score of 10 or better (15-point scale) or 2- or better (on 6-point scale), and DAAD of at least 4 (****) out of 5 stars for each band (equivalent of B2 or higher)
- **Norway:** 4.0 or higher in final-year English for Vitnemål for videregående opplæring
- **Sweden:** Grade of C (VG) or better in English 5 and 6 (English A and B) for Slutbetyg/Examensbevis från Gymnasieskolan

If you can't provide the above, we may also consider:

- An approved alternative language test (for example TOEFL or Duolingo)*
- A statement from your home institute testifying that your language ability is sufficient to meet English language entry requirements
- Previous university study in English

Gap-year students

If you've recently completed high school and/or are applying for Study Abroad at AUT during your first year of university, your application will be considered based on completion of a secondary qualification showing evidence of having met New Zealand's University Entrance requirements. Application checklist

You will need to have certain documents ready when you apply:

- Current passport that won't expire while you're in New Zealand
- Official, current transcript
- IELTS results if applicable

Application deadlines

Make sure you apply by:

- 30 November each year (to start in February/Semester 1)
- 31 May each year (to start in July/Semester 2)

Late applications may be possible – contact your home university advisor, agency counsellor or the AUT Study Abroad team for more information.

Fees and costs

The current fees for our Study Abroad programme are listed below. All prices are in New Zealand dollars.

Fees per semester for 2026

- Tuition fee for Study Abroad: NZ\$13,000 per semester (for AUT 60 points)
- Placement fee (study-internship option only): NZ\$1,000
- Compulsory insurance premium: NZ\$449.50 per semester
- Student Services Levy: NZ\$610.80 per semester

If you're applying through one of our Study Abroad partners, they may pay your fees on your behalf. Please check with them for all associated programme costs and fees.

Living costs

If you're coming to New Zealand on a student visa, Immigration New Zealand currently requires you to have enough funds to cover a return ticket home. You will also need to have enough money to adequately cover your living costs. Living costs can vary considerably depending on your lifestyle. New Zealand student visa

Once you've been accepted, one of the most important next steps is to get your student visa organised before you reach New Zealand. Medical and travel insurance

The New Zealand Government requires all international students to have appropriate insurance. Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of the treatment. That's why it's so important that you have medical and travel insurance while studying at AUT. To make it easy, we include AUT's default medical insurance, the Studentsafe Inbound University plan, as part of your Offer of Place. However, you don't have to accept the AUT insurance policy, and can choose an alternative from an approved provider on our website. To find out more visit aut.ac.nz/international/insurance
