



Learn English at GELI

Your direct English pathway to a Griffith University degree, Study Abroad or Exchange program, or a Griffith College program.

Direct Entry Program

Join our highly popular Direct Entry Program to gain the English skills necessary to enter a Griffith University degree or a program at Griffith College.

There are seven levels in the Direct Entry Program and you will be placed in the appropriate class for you based on your proficiency test or your Griffith English Test result.

In our classes, you will use technology to access your learning materials and complete your class work.

In the Direct Entry Program, you will build your English language skills in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking, and at the higher levels you will practise academic skills that will help you to be successful in your future studies.

When you successfully complete the Direct Entry Program at the equivalent of the IELTS level needed for your degree or diploma, you can enter your program directly without needing to submit a proficiency test result.*

General English

GELI classes

Class sizes at GELI are small so you will receive personal attention from your teachers and progress quickly through your studies.

There are 20 hours of study per week, plus an additional 5 hours of independent learning each week using GELI's independent learning plans. You will need a laptop to access learning resources and for some class activities.

Classes are held daily Monday to Friday in two 2-hour sessions with a break between the sessions.



PTE Academic Test Centre

Griffith's PTE Academic Test Centre is located on the Gold Coast campus. PTE Academic is a computer-based test of English language proficiency for study, migration and professional registration. Tests results are typically available within five business days.

Whether you would like to live on campus or off campus, there are several options you can explore to find housing to suit your needs. Options include Homestay, which allows you to experience life with a local family while you study.

Temporary and short-stay accommodation

If you are intending to organise long-term off-campus accommodation once you arrive in Queensland, it is vitally important that you organise temporary accommodation for your first few days or weeks in Queensland, as it is important that you inspect your long-term off-campus accommodation before you move in. There are short-term accommodation options located near each of our campuses that are easily accessible by public transport.

Off campus

In Australia, share housing—where you share a house or apartment with a number of other students—is the most common form of off-campus accommodation.

When looking for suitable off-campus accommodation, you will need to consider:

- the cost of rent (usually advertised as a weekly amount)
- if utilities are included in your rent (electricity, water, gas)
- if internet is included in your rent
- if the accommodation is furnished
- how close the accommodation is to your campus
- access to public transport.

Off-campus accommodation preferred partners

The University has preferred partnerships with a selection of student accommodation providers in Brisbane and the Gold Coast. To ensure the quality and safety of these accommodation options, they have been inspected by Griffith University staff and have met performance and standards criteria.

Homestay

Homestay accommodation gives you the opportunity to live with an Australian family while you study. It is a great way to develop your English language skills and experience life in Australia, and offers catered and self-catered options. Homestay is available to GELI students studying in Brisbane City and at the Gold Coast. Some homestay providers offer independent living options such as a granny flat.

On campus

Griffith offers self-catered accommodation at Nathan campus and partners with Campus Living Villages to provide self-catered, on-campus accommodation in the Griffith University Village on the Gold Coast campus.

Please note that there is no on-site student accommodation at GELI Brisbane City, but it is ideally located near purpose-built student accommodation buildings (see 'off-campus' information).

Our Gold Coast campus is set to boast a new student accommodation tower. It is forecast for completion in 2026, with 459 new beds to be available.

Cost of living

There are many different costs involved in international study and your cost of living in Australia will vary depending on your lifestyle and personal requirements.

South East Queensland offers a combination of quality education and high living standards.

The Australian Government requires students on a student visa to have access to a minimum of A\$29,710* per year to meet their living costs, but most students spend more than this. Costs will be higher if you have family members accompanying you.

Calculating your total cost of study

Your total cost of studying in Australia will include:

- tuition fees
- visa application fees
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- flights
- cost of living
- other personal and study-related expenses.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees are reviewed annually, and students should expect an increase in fees each year.

Weekly cost of living estimate

Please be advised these figures are an estimate only and individual differences mean prices will vary. Please note these costs do not include: arrival costs, temporary /short-term accommodation, security deposit, textbooks, clothing and medical expenses. Include certified copies of any required documentation (translated into English if applicable).

APPLY ONLINE

Apply online or via a registered recruitment representative. If you are applying for a Griffith University degree or Study Abroad or Exchange program, you will receive a packaged offer and we will let you know how many weeks of English you need to complete to achieve your study goals in your Letter of Offer.

If you are applying only for an English language program, you will receive an offer for your chosen number of weeks.

ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

Once you have received a Letter of Offer, you must formally accept your offer and pay your total deposit fee.

AFTER YOU ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

Once you have accepted your offer, Griffith University will:

- send you a Welcome Letter confirming your enrolment;
- send you an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCOE) if you are applying for a student visa;
- provide information about Orientation;
- send you a series of emails with information to assist your transition to study at GELI.
