Study Abroad program

30CP – A\$10,194

40CP – A\$11,645

Exchange program

Exchange students are nominated by a Griffith partner university and are not required to pay tuition fees to Griffith University. Any tuition fees are paid to your home university.

Most students will be required to cover the cost of Overseas Student Health Cover.

How many courses can I study?

At Griffith, a typical full-time study load is 30 to 40 credit points (CP). One course (subject) is usually worth 10CP. You can choose from the following options per trimester:

- 30CP – 3 courses
- 40CP – 4 courses

10CP = 3 to 4 credits in the US system
10CP = 7.5 ECTS in the European system

Note: the above information should be used as a guide only.

English + University

Our English + University program is the best way to meet Griffith's English language entry requirements before you begin your Study Abroad trimester (or year). English + University students complete Griffith English Language Institute's award winning Direct Entry Program then begin their Griffith University Study Abroad program as a confident English speaker, listener, reader and writer. Additional fees apply.

The Community Internship is a 10-credit point course, available to students from all disciplines. Through this course you will be able to make a difference in a local community organisation while developing a range of professional and personal skills. You will spend a minimum of 50 hours in a not-for-profit organisation placement and combine this with academic learning. With hundreds of internship opportunities, we can tailor the internship to match your study area or interests. Please be aware that this course is only available to Study Abroad students, it is not available to Exchange students.

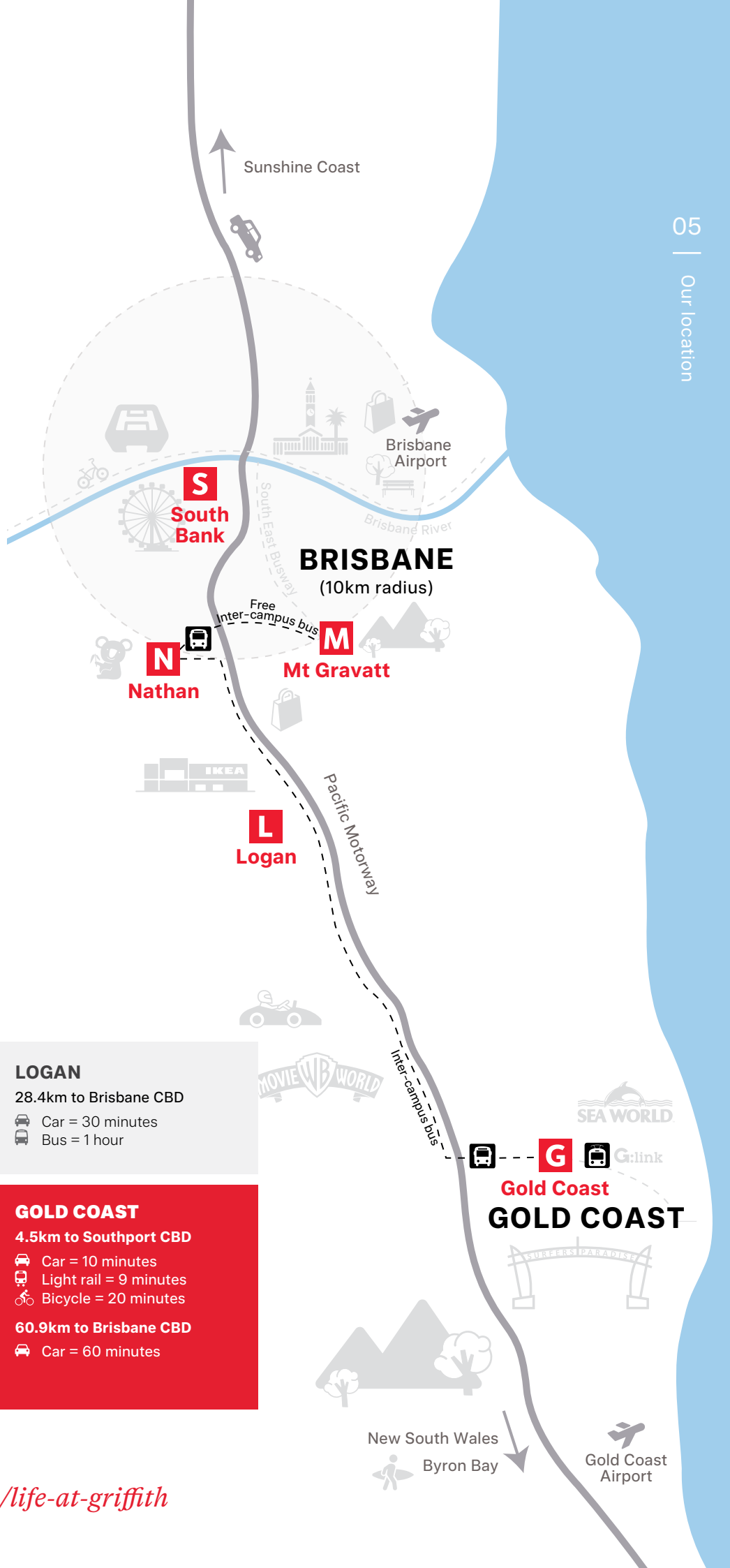

WHERE TO LIVE

Whether you would like to live on campus or off campus, there are several options you can explore to find housing to suit your needs. Options include Homestay, which allows you to experience life with a local family while you study.

Temporary and short-stay accommodation

If you are intending to organise long-term off-campus accommodation once you arrive in Queensland, it is vitally important that you organise temporary accommodation for your first few days or weeks in Queensland, as it is important that you inspect your long-term off-campus accommodation before you move in. There are short-term accommodation options located near each of our campuses that are easily accessible by public transport.

Off campus

In Australia, share housing—where you share a house or apartment with a number of other students—is the most common form of off-campus accommodation.

When looking for suitable off-campus accommodation, you will need to consider:

- the cost of rent (usually advertised as a weekly amount)
- if utilities are included in your rent (electricity, water, gas)
- if internet is included in your rent
- if the accommodation is furnished
- how close the accommodation is to your campus
- access to public transport.

Off-campus accommodation preferred partners

The University has preferred partnerships with a selection of student accommodation providers in Brisbane and the Gold Coast. To ensure the quality and safety of these accommodation options, they have been inspected by Griffith University staff and have met performance and standards criteria.

Homestay

Homestay accommodation gives you the opportunity to live with an Australian family while you study. It is a great way to develop your English language skills and experience life in Australia, and offers catered and self-catered options. Homestay is available to students at all Griffith campuses. Some homestay providers offer independent living options such as a granny flat.

On campus

Griffith offers self-catered accommodation at Nathan campus and partners with Campus Living Villages to provide self-catered, on-campus accommodation in the Griffith University Village on the Gold Coast campus.

Living on campus is a fantastic way to meet new people, find out about new cultures and develop independence. On-campus accommodation is fully furnished and provides access to cooking facilities, laundry facilities, common rooms and internet, as well as offering a vibrant social life.

Airport pickup

International students commencing at Griffith University can apply for a free airport pickup, which takes you from the airport directly to your pre-arranged accommodation. The service is free for eligible new international students arriving at the Brisbane or Gold Coast airports.

New accommodation in 2026

Our Gold Coast campus is set to boast a new student accommodation tower. It is forecast for completion in 2026, with 459 new beds to be available.

Cost of living

There are many different costs involved in international study and your cost of living in Australia will vary depending on your lifestyle and personal requirements.

South East Queensland offers a combination of quality education and high living standards. The Australian Government requires students to have access to a minimum of **A\$29,710*** per year to meet their living costs, but most students spend more than this. Costs will be higher if you have family members accompanying you.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees are reviewed annually, and international students should expect an increase in fees each year.

Your total cost of studying in Australia will include:

- tuition fees
- visa application fees
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- flights
- cost of living
- other personal and study-related expenses.

How to apply

You can complete your Study Abroad or Exchange Program application in four simple steps.

Study Abroad applicants:

1 CHECK YOU MEET ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS.

You must have an above average overall grade point average (equivalent to 4.5 on Griffith's 7.0 scale).

Students straight from high school may be eligible for this program.

OR Exchange applicants:

1 REQUEST NOMINATION FROM YOUR HOME UNIVERSITY.

If you are from an exchange partner university, you must be nominated by your home university and meet their exchange program requirements to be eligible for the program.

2 CHECK YOU MEET ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS.

If you are from a non-English speaking background, you must provide proof of English language proficiency, equivalent to IELTS overall 6.0 (6.5 for postgraduate students). Visit the link below for detailed English language requirements.

3 PREPARE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION.

Include a copy of the most recent official academic transcript (including academic grading scale)*; proof of English language proficiency (if required); copy of passport.

*Students may be asked for certified copies of the documentation listed above, i.e. signed and stamped by a home university representative, agent or provider.

4 APPLY ONLINE.

Apply online or via a registered recruitment representative.
