

- Host families: Thanksgiving, Halloween, Public holidays









Application

Deadlines: Fall Semester: April 1; Spring Semester: November 1 Process

- Step 1: Complete and submit the following documents by email
- <u>Nomination form</u> to be completed by your international advisor
- <u>Visiting/exchange student application form</u>
- Recent photograph (passport photo preferred)
- TOEFL or IELTS Official Score Report or Home University Approved
- University transcripts

After admission

- Submit bank statement from a sponsor demonstrating that you have sufficient funds to pay for the program
- Pay \$400 deposit by deadline (May 15 (for fall admittance; November 2 for spring admittance)
- Complete <u>Medical Form</u> by deadline (July 15 for fall admittance; January 2 for spring admittance)
- Prepare for arrival at Hartwick College
 - Read <u>arrival information</u>
 - Consult our <u>airport transportation policy & complete a</u> transportation request
