



Achieving your potential at UL

With a graduate employment rate that is consistently higher than the national average, University of Limerick's graduates find employment in all sectors of the economy. Over 95% of University of Limerick graduates successfully gained employment within six months of graduation or chose to continue with further studies.

Career Services provides information and support to help students to develop and implement effective career plans in preparation for graduation and beyond. Resources include careers advice and information, career planning seminars, on-campus career fairs, company presentations, mock interviews, and job vacancy notifications.

Student Work Permits and Graduate Employment

Non-EU students are permitted to work part-time up to 20 hours per week during the academic semester. During holiday periods (summer and Christmas breaks) students can work a full 40-hour week. Students graduating with a level-8 honours undergraduate bachelor's degree can apply for a 12-month graduate visa once final results are received. For students graduating with a minimum of level-9 master's degree, the period of employment is up to 24 months once final results are received. Graduates are eligible to work for up to 40 hours per week.

University of Limerick has gained an unrivalled reputation for partnering with 1,700 industry-leading employers including Deloitte, Stryker, Analog Devices, Boeing and Intel. Students have the opportunity to develop practical working skills during their studies, which significantly improves employment prospects after graduation. Undergraduate Academic Entry Requirements

Undergraduate candidates must obtain an educational qualification equivalent to the Irish Leaving Certificate, A Levels (UK system) or International Baccalaureate.

Undergraduate Application Process and Deadline

Applications for 2025/26 open in October 2024 and can be made on www.ul.ie directly from the programme page. Applications must be submitted by 1 July 2025 for September 2025 entry. However, it is advisable to apply well in advance to secure your place. The application processing time is approximately 14 - 21 working days.

All applications must be accompanied by certification of all educational qualifications and certification demonstrating a high level of proficiency in English. Applicants who have not yet completed final exams or English language test, can receive a conditional offer by submitting predicted grades.

Postgraduate Degrees

Postgraduate Academic Entry Requirements

Applicants must hold a qualification that is equivalent to an Irish or UK honours bachelor's degree (NFQ level 8). In many cases, the degree must be in a discipline relevant to the postgraduate degree sought.

Postgraduate Application Process and Deadline

Applications for 2025/26 open in October 2024 and can be made on www.ul.ie directly from the programme page. Applications must be submitted by 1 July 2025 for September 2025 entry. However, it is advisable to apply well in advance to secure your place. The application processing time is approximately 14 - 21 working days.

Postgraduate applicants may be subject to interviews with academic course leaders.

Applications must include certified results for all examinations mentioned on the application form and confirmation of the award of qualifications. Applicants who have not yet completed final exams or an English language test, can receive a conditional offer by submitting predicted grades. Evidence of English language proficiency and certified translations of awards and transcripts should also be submitted.





Scholarships

There are merit-based scholarships available to high achieving full-time undergraduate and postgraduate students. These are awarded across all faculties. Scholarships are valued between €2,000 and €2,500, depending on the faculty applied to and availability.

There are a number of special international scholarships, which include the China Scholarship Council (CSC), Kemmy Business School Jim Kemmy India Scholarship, and the iGeneration Foundation (IGF) Scholarship.

International Foundation Programme

This programme is managed by the University of Limerick Language Centre. It is a one-year full-time programme that offers international high school students an alternative route to undergraduate study. It is suitable for international students who do not hold qualifications equivalent to the Irish Leaving Certificate or A-Level, or who need a further boost to their English language skills.

Students who have completed high school through the medium of English can choose a 'Foundation Plus' programme which focuses less on English language and more on academic modules.

There are three streams:

- Foundation in Science & Engineering
- Foundation in Arts, Law & Humanities
- Foundation in Business

The English language required is an IELTS score of 5.0, with no less than 5.0 in any one component, or the equivalent in a different qualification. Tuition fees cost €12,000 and there is a €50 application fee.



Preparation for University Programmes

The University of Limerick Language Centre offers a variety of courses to ensure that each student reaches their language goals.

The Preparation for University programme caters for the language needs of students who intend to study for an undergraduate or postgraduate degree at University of Limerick. It is designed for students who have reached the academic entry requirements for their chosen degree but need to improve their English in order to meet the English language entry requirement. It is suitable for applicants who have received a conditional offer from University of Limerick. Programme length varies depending on level of English.

Students who achieve a final passing grade in pre-sessional English exams will have met the English language requirements for entry to the majority of programmes at University of Limerick (equivalent IELTS 6.5). It will not be necessary for such students to take an external English language test at the end of the Preparation for University programme.

Structured and Research PhD

PhD programmes (both structured and traditional) at the University of Limerick are designed to support you in achieving your academic and professional objectives. Typically taking four years to complete, a PhD provides you with a range of skills, such as networking and communications, leadership, and the ability to publish your research findings. The outcome of your research is a thesis, on which you will be examined orally (a viva voce examination).

Postgraduate research students benefit from the experience of international researchers and the availability of state-of-the-art equipment at our research institutes and centres. UL has strong links with industry from undergraduate to postdoctoral level. The employment rate of our graduates has always been exceptional. Our figures show that over 87% of UL Research master's graduates and 96% of PhD graduates are engaged in employment or further study following graduation.

Applying for Postgraduate Research Degree

The first step in applying for a graduate research position is to identify a potential supervisor and project. If you have difficulty in identifying a potential supervisor, you should complete an Expression of Interest form, available from the How to Apply section of the Doctoral College (www.ul.ie/research/ doctoral-college)

Once you have identified a supervisor and project, you should complete a research application form and submit it to the Graduate & Professional Studies Office. Application forms are available at



www.ul.ie/gps/about/how-apply

UL accepts research applications throughout the year.

The minimum entry requirement to a postgraduate research degree is an honours primary degree (level 8 – as defined by the National Qualifications Authority of Ireland) with a minimum classification of a 2:1 or 2:2. Individual faculties or research centres may have specific entry requirements.

In addition to the minimum entry requirements specified above, international student applicants are required to meet the following standard English language requirements: IELTS score of 6-6.5 and not less than 6 in any one component for entry to the Faculty of Science & Engineering and a composite score in the range of 6.5-7 and not less than 6 in any one component for entry to t he Faculties of Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences, Education & Health Sciences and the Kemmy Business School.

Funding

Funding for postgraduate research is available from a variety of sources. Individual faculties at UL may offer scholarships or funded positions while external funding is available from Irish and international research councils, other public bodies and the private sector. The main research council in Ireland is the Irish Research Council, which funds postgraduate scholarships for Science, Engineering and Technology and Humanities and Social Sciences.
