Summer at Regent's

Six weeks

Choose up to two modules from Fashion, two from Liberal Arts, or mix and match – joining workshops, seminars, field trips, guest speakers and a range of activities that draw on the city's history and culture. You'll earn up to 12 ECTS or 24 CATS.

Twelve weeks

Stage one

Your first six weeks comprises a term on campus taking two fashion modules, worth 12 ECTS/24 CATS, and experiencing study trips in London.

Stage two

You'll take one tutorial module alongside your placement, which will underpin your academic and professional experience. This module is worth 10 ECTS/20 CATS.

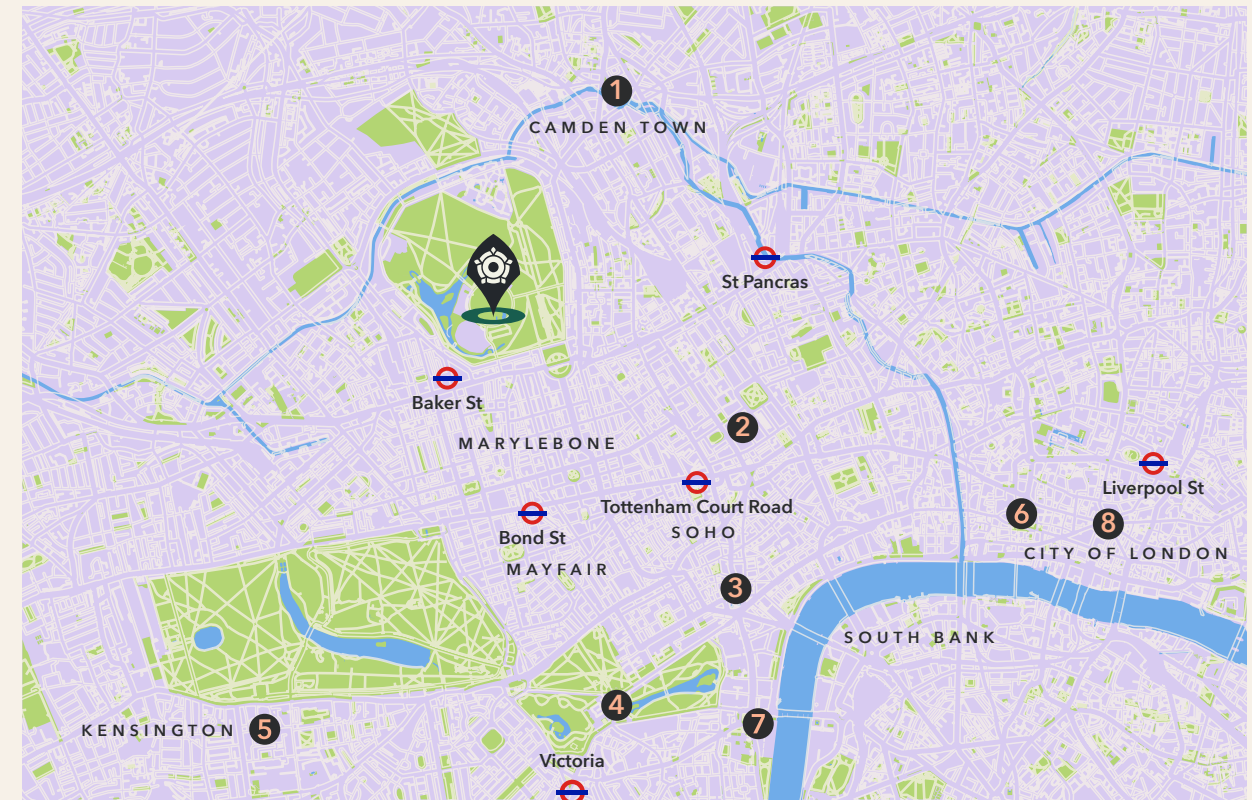

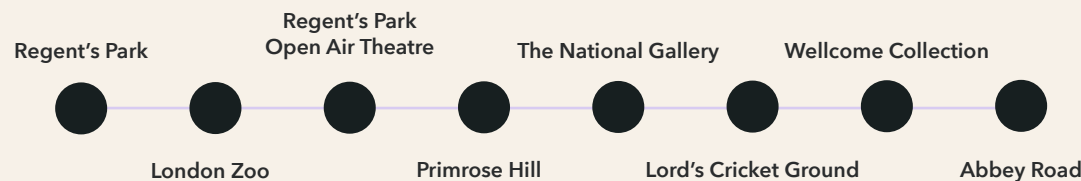

Application process

Nominations

If you think Regent's might be your choice for study abroad, you'll need to have a conversation with your home university and they'll need to nominate you. We'll send them a form when nominations open

If you're a free mover, you should enquire directly:

Applications

When you're nominated, you'll receive an email from us with instructions on how to apply online. You'll need to have the following items ready:

- A copy of your passport (photo page and adjacent page)
- A copy of your most recent official academic transcripts*
- A short personal statement (free movers only)

If you're applying for two terms, you'll also need:

- A copy of an approved English language test - gov.uk/student-visa/knowledge-of-english

*If documents aren't issued in English, we require the original as well as an official translation.

Offer and acceptance

You'll receive an offer letter within four weeks of applying, provided all your documents are received on time. To accept, you'll need to accept the University's policies and for students who pay the fees directly to Regent's, pay a non-refundable deposit

- One term and summer programme: £1,000
- Two terms: £1,000

Visas & Immigration

If you plan to study with us for one term (less than six months), you'll need to enter the UK under the Visitor route. Depending on your nationality, you'll need to apply for a Visitor visa or an ETA (Electronic Travel Authorisation) before traveling. Find out which applies to you.

If you study with us for two terms (over six months), you'll need a Student Visa.
