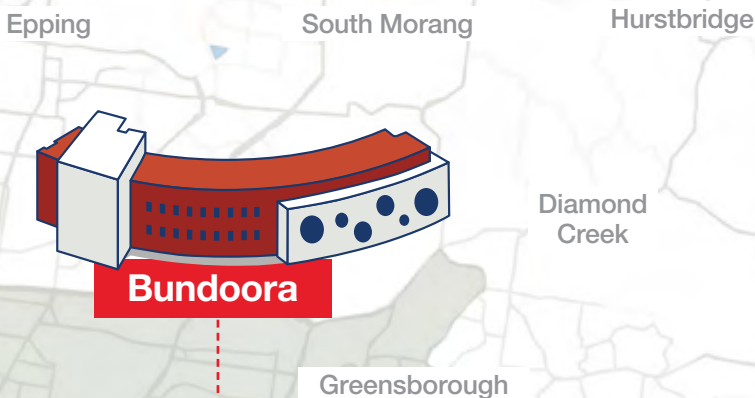

Work-integrated learning (WIL)

WIL is an activity where you apply your academic learning in a real-life situation with an industry or community partner.

Higher education and vocational education students can complete a WIL activity, which is formally assessed for credit towards your qualification. The type of WIL activities you undertake will depend on your course and study discipline, and can occur on or off campus. They may be:

- work placements such as clinical placements, internships or field education or professional practices
- projects with industry and community-based organisations
- art projects with exhibitions

WIL simulations are activities where you practise using technology, equipment or activities that are not possible to complete in an industry setting, e.g. moot courts.

Pathways.

RMIT University Pathways (RMIT UP) specialises in academic English and Foundation Studies programs for international students, preparing you to succeed at university.

Academic English Pathways

RMIT UP delivers the English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program, which gives you the academic English skills you need to pathway into a course at RMIT University.

The 2027 fees per week for the EAP program are \$AU565, plus an \$AU260 enrolment fee.

- There are six EAP levels (Elementary to Advanced Plus) with each level taking 10 weeks of full-time study to complete.
- To meet the requirement for your chosen RMIT course, you must successfully complete the academic English level on your letter of offer.
- We will place you in a class that matches your most recent IELTS or other recognised English language proficiency test results (not more than 24 months old). See table below for the test result required for each level.

Note: If you do not have a recent IELTS score (or English test equivalent) you can complete a Placement Test.

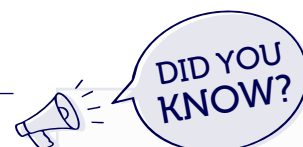

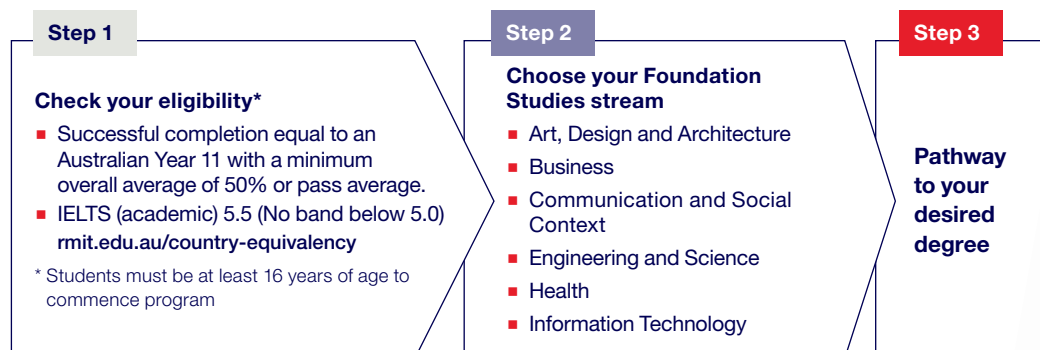
Foundation Studies Pathways

Foundation Studies equips you with the skills you need to be university ready and offers a direct pathway into RMIT University. Choose from one of six Foundation Studies streams for your first year of study and pathway into your desired vocational or undergraduate course.

The 2027 tuition fee for Foundation Studies is \$AU34,250, and the study duration is one year of full-time study. If you are undertaking the Art, Design and Architecture stream, or any mathematics courses, there are also non-tuition fees associated, which you can learn more about on the Foundation Studies program page.

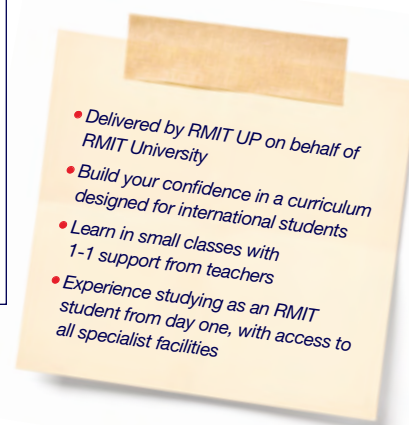

University Pathways Fast Track

RMIT UP's Fast Track is an accelerated pathway for high-achieving international students, preparing you for university in half the time of a Foundation Studies course.

Study the subjects that align with your goals and interests

With Fast Track, you can choose from streams in:

- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics)
- Art, Design and Architecture
- Business
- Communication and Social Context (available from Semester 1, 2027)

Check your eligibility

- Successful completion equal to an Australian Year 11 with a minimum overall average of 70%.
- IELTS (academic) 6 (No band below 5.5)
- Students must be at least 17 years of age to commence program.
- The STEM, Business and Art, Design and Architecture streams also have prerequisites.

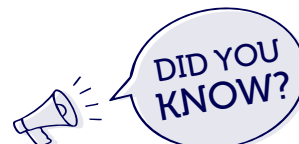

Are you under 18?

If you'll be under the age of 18 when you arrive in Australia, you must have accommodation and welfare arrangements organised and approved either by the Department of Home Affairs or RMIT before you leave home. This is to ensure you have proper day-to-day support to keep you safe and well.

Plan your budget.

Understand the cost of living as a student in Melbourne.

These weekly costs are estimated based on the average prices and lifestyles of students in Melbourne.



Food

(Groceries and eating out)

The lower end of this estimate reflects eating meals at home every day, while the upper end includes five or more meals at a restaurant.¹



Phone

This estimate is indicative of cheap to moderate mobile plans.¹



Public transport

This estimate is based on the concession prices of using public transport.²



Car

This estimate is indicative of fuel, registration and maintenance costs of driving a car at least four times a week.¹



Entertainment

The lower end of this estimate is indicative of going to the cinema, live music/sport or a night out once a week. The upper end reflects doing one of these activities five to six times a week.¹



Public transport

As an RMIT student, you may be eligible for discounted travel on public transport. Melbourne has a vast public transport network of trams, buses and trains. There are tram and train lines near each of RMIT's campuses, and the City campus is within Melbourne's Free Tram Zone.

Rent

Your rent will vary in Melbourne depending on your proximity to the CBD. Below is an indication of rental costs where RMIT's campuses are located.³

- 1 bedroom unit in Melbourne City – \$550 per week
- 1 bedroom unit in Brunswick – \$450 per week
- 1 bedroom unit in Bundoora – \$400 per week
