Nomination and application process

Nomination and application deadlines

For study in Semester 1 2025

- Nomination deadline: 15 November 2024
- Application deadline: 30 November 2024

For Study in Semester 2 2025

- Nomination deadline: 15 April 2025
- Application deadline: 30 April 2025

USYD advisers will share the relevant application guide with your nominated students

Application details

Within one week of their nomination, students will be emailed with further application instructions. The following document will be required:

- Official academic transcript – copy of front and back with English translation (if original not issued in English)
- Evidence of identity
- Proof of English Proficiency
- List of preferred units of study
- Portfolios (Architecture and Studio Art major studios only)



Application lifecycle

1. Nomination received
2. Application instructions sent to student
3. Application submitted online by student
4. Application processed by University of Sydney
5. Offer made through Sydney Student Portal
6. Student accepts offer and organises OSHC
7. Acceptance and payment (if relevant) processed by University of Sydney
8. Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) issued to student
9. Student applies for relevant visa
10. Enrolment made available to student prior to arrival



Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Purchasing OSHC is a mandatory requirement of the Subclass 500 Student Visa. Most students purchase their OSHC through us, which we organise with Allianz, who have an assistance counter on campus. OSHC must be purchased from one of the below 6 providers approved by the Department of Home Affairs:
